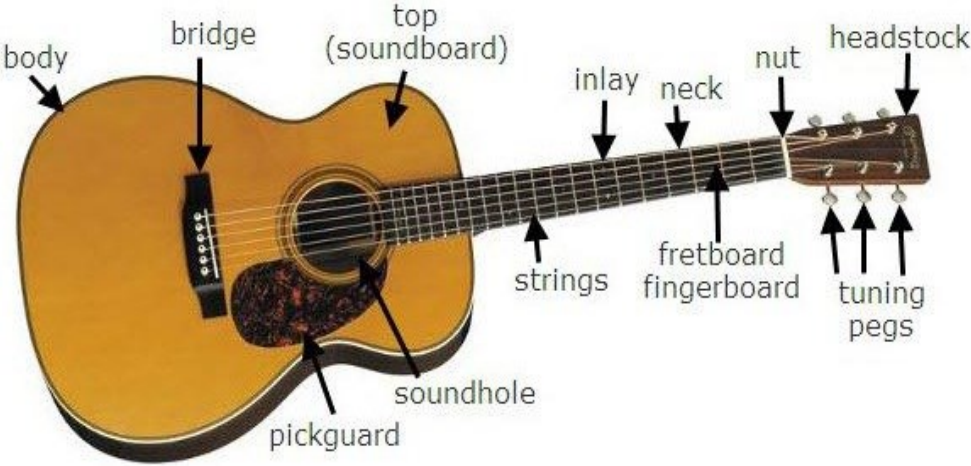

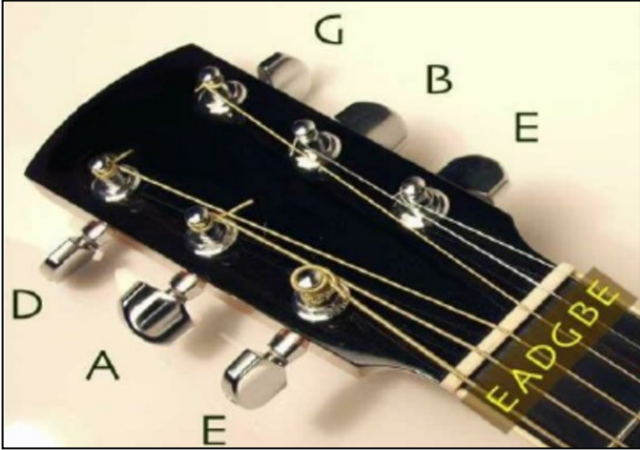


Acoustic Guitar

(**EADGBE**)

- E (1st string)
- B (2nd string)
- G (3rd string)
- D (4th string)
- A (5th string)
- E (6th string)

Eclipse Tuner

- Place tuner on top of head stock (near tuning keys) of the guitar or ukulele
- Press power button to turn tuner on
- Strum string to be tuned, continuing to strum the string till the desired note appears on the tuner screen

If you think you're tuning the string too high or too far, may we suggest you stop, crank the string back down (loosen), and start again. One thing to practice before you get started is to go to any string and play with the tuning key, find out how much tuning makes the note go up or down.

Yellow lines on tuner = flat note
Red lines on tuner = sharp note
Blue arrows on tuner = correct note

Repeat for each string until all strings are tuned.
