With your library card you will have access to the current and historical *New York Times*, international editions, Spanish and Chinese language editions, and special features, unfortunately it does not include the crossword.

This free new service is now available from any desktop computer, borrowed chrome book or on your own device at any one of our branches. Your access is automatic once you create an account and log in at nytimes.com. From home, work, or on the go, you will find the *New York Times* link <https://cpl.social/nytimescpl> on our Digital Library page on our website where you can claim your free 72-hour pass for *New York Times* online access. Once the pass expires, you simply have to revisit the CPL website to get another pass. Apps for Android, Blackberry, iOS and Windows phone are also available in your app store and can be used once authenticated.
