From tapping the spike into the tree, to boiling the sap in big kettles over the fire, they have fun with each other and enjoy the whole process!

The StoryWalks will be installed along the Adam Wallace Park (128 Cedargrove Road) in Bolton and in Caledon East on the trail starting by the Walk of Fame display west of Airport Road.
